NetSuite isn't a single product — it's a suite of modules on one platform. The value comes from turning on the right ones and configuring them for how your business actually works. That configuration is where most of the outcome is won or lost.

The core {modules}

These are the building blocks most companies start with. You don't need all of them on day one — a typical first phase covers financials plus one or two operational modules.



Financial Management

General ledger, AP/AR, and real-time financial reporting. The foundation every NetSuite deployment is built on.



Inventory & Order Management

Track stock across locations, automate fulfillment, and manage purchasing and demand planning in one place.



CRM

Leads, opportunities, quotes, and customer records connected directly to orders and invoices — no re-keying.



SuiteCommerce (Ecommerce)

Native web store and B2B/B2C ecommerce that shares the same inventory and customer data as the back office.



SuiteAnalytics

Saved searches, dashboards, and reporting that surface real-time data across every module without exports.



SuiteFlow (Automation)

Build approval workflows and automate manual steps — the engine that removes the busywork your team still does.



Multi-Subsidiary / OneWorld

Run multiple entities, currencies, and tax jurisdictions with automated consolidation across the group.



Billing & Revenue Recognition

Subscription billing, usage models, and compliant revenue recognition for modern revenue structures.

WORTH KNOWING BEFORE YOU BUY

NetSuite research shows most customers use less than 60% of the modules they license within the first year. The platform's capability is rarely the constraint — configuration, adoption, and ongoing ownership are. Plan for those before signing, not after.

NetSuite scales across a wide revenue band, but the right starting footprint depends on where you are.

EMERGING

Startups & early growth

~\$2M–\$20M revenue

Start with financials and one operational module. The draw is replacing spreadsheets with a system you won't outgrow in two years.

SCALING

SMB & mid-market

~\$20M–\$200M revenue

Multi-location inventory, multiple entities, and automation become the reason to move. This is NetSuite's core sweet spot.

NetSuite is likely a strong fit if you:

- Are outgrowing QuickBooks or a patchwork of disconnected tools
- Operate across multiple locations, entities, or currencies
- Need real-time visibility across finance and operations
- Want one platform you can grow into rather than replace
